- 1. Create an architecture / environment which will fit into the **character** of the Rowland Heights
  - Community:
- Culturally DiverseMulti-Generational
- Different Ages (Youth-Seniors)
- 2. Enhance **social engagement** between the user groups.
- 3. Create a place / landmark which functionally enhances and symbolically presents the *Unity* of the Rowland Heights Community.
- 4. Maximize **indoor-outdoor** space / flow / function between the Community Center and the regional park site to capitalize on the park setting.
- 5. Maximize *View* and *openness* of interior space toward an outdoor open, green park.
- 6. Make **flexibility** and **multi-purpose use** the keywords of the design.
- 7. Implement **high** quality in design / materials / systems / performance with **low** maintenance and cost consciousness.
- 8. Obtain at least a **Silver LEED Rating** in sustainable design.
- 9. Provide an environment which is **Safe** and **Secure** (outdoor lighting / ease of access to parking).
- 10. Integrate *Civic art* into the design.
- 11. **Expandability** to accommodate possible growth.
- 12. Design should satisfy and meet ADA (American with Disabilities Act) codes / requirements.
